

#### IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM FATHER SERAFINO:

"We are facing a moment of great turbulence in the Church due to the plague of sexual abuse and coverups by Church authorities. These abuses are not primarily paedophilic, but are for the most part ephebophilic (involving sexual interest in adolescents) and homosexual; more than 80% of clerical sexual abuses involve adolescent boys. These abuses, which are always delicts (crimes) in the eyes of Church law, seem now quite widespread. They have been perpetrated not only in the USA, as we know from the McCarrick case and the Pennsylvania grand jury report, but also in Ireland, Australia, Chile and Honduras, and very soon there will be an independent report into child sexual abuse in England and Wales as well. In the meantime, an 11-page letter, written by a former Apostolic Nuncio to the USA, Msgr Carlo Maria Vigano, who is accusing Pope Francis of covering up the McCarrick case, has come out. Vigano is known to be a trustworthy person, and the American Cardinal DiNardo has stated that 'the questions raised [by Vigano] deserve answers that are conclusive and based on evidence.' Let us all pray in this moment of dismay that truth and justice may soon triumph, and that the Immaculate Church will emerge victorious over impurity and corruption. 
## CHILDREN'S CATECHISM:

## The Miracle of God's Grace

(Mk 7:37)



While the miracles of Jesus astound the people, the real transformation of Jesus' miracles is in the soul. Jesus frees us from sin, which blinds us and makes us deaf to spiritual things. Jesus opens our ears to hear the Word of God, and loosens our tongue to praise and proclaim the miraculous works of God. He opens our eyes to see the truths of our faith. How many of us are blind, deaf and dumb to the truths of the Catholic faith! How many are bound up in sin and in great darkness! They are spiritually blind, deaf to truth, and too ignorant to speak of God's truth.

St Augustine, in commenting on today's Gospel, says "that the tongue of someone united to God will speak of the good, will bring to agreement those who are divided, will console those who weep. God will be praised, Christ will be announced." When the truth of God comes into our lives, we will enjoy the fruits of the Holy Ghost: charity, peace, joy, patience, kindness, gentleness, generosity, goodness, faithfulness, chastity, modesty and continence (cf. Gal 5:22-24). These fruits will only come into the lives of those who live in sanctifying grace by obeying God's Commandments. To be in God's friendship, we must avoid mortal sin, which destroys the life of grace in the soul. This is the miracle of which Isaiah speaks when he says of the coming of the Messiah, "Then shall the lame man leap as a hart, and the tongue of the dumb shall be free: for waters are broken out in the desert, and streams in the wilderness. And that which was dry land, shall become a pool, and the thirsty land springs of water." (Is 35:6-7) Jesus Christ brings us springs of living water with His grace to give us an abundant life in our souls: "He that believeth in me, as the scripture saith, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water." (Jn 7:38) St James tells us in the Second Reading, "Hearken, my dearest brethren: hath not God chosen the poor in this world, rich in faith, and heirs of the kingdom which God hath promised to them that love him?" (Jas 2:5)

These rivers of living water (grace) that Jesus promises us will be for eternal life. This is what Jesus promised us in the Gospels for the last few weeks: "I am the living bread which came down from heaven. If any man eat of this bread, he shall live for ever; and the bread that I will give, is my flesh, for the life of the world." (Jn 6:51-52) Jesus will give us eternal life if we eat of His Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist. No longer will we be blind, deaf, dumb or lame, as we are in this life. Whatever earthly suffering we have endured will be turned into heavenly glory. There will be no mourning, no sickness, and no suffering in heaven. We will see God face-to-face and praise Him for His goodness in redeeming our souls from sin. In heaven, we will have a multitude of delights, as St Paul tells us: "That eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither hath it entered into the heart of man, what things God hath prepared for them that love him." (I Cor 2:9) What the prophet Isaiah says of the coming of the Messiah for the Jewish people is only a foreshadowing of the heavenly banquet that God has in store for those who love Him and keep His Commandments. At present, in this life, we do not see truly as we are blind, deaf, dumb and lame to the wonderful life God has prepared for us in eternity. We need to pray that all souls will be transformed by the miracle of God's grace and become pure of heart, that they might see God in this life: "Blessed are the clean of heart: for they shall see God." (Mt 5:8)
