



The First Reading from today's Mass, from the Book of Proverbs, includes the Lord's timeless invitation to all souls: "Whosoever is a little one, let him come to me. And to the unwise she said: Come, eat my bread, and drink the wine which I have mingled for you." (Prov 9:4-5) The banquet is a an image frequently found in the Sacred Scripture. It is used to announce the coming of the Messiah, full of good things and blessings; Francis Fernandez, in his Conversation with God, tells us that, "in a special way, the banquet is a prefiguring of the Holy Eucharist wherein Jesus Christ gives Himself to us as food." In the Gospel for today, St John records Jesus' words in the Synagogue of Capharnaum, where He promises to give the Jews the true bread of heaven, His own flesh, for their salvation: "He that eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, hath everlasting life: and I will raise him up in the last day. For my flesh is meat indeed: and my blood is drink indeed. He that eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, abideth in me, and I in him." (Jn 6:55-57) Jesus gives us His Body and Blood to eat and drink, and promises all those who do so eternal life: "I am the living bread which came down from heaven. If any man eat of this bread, he shall live for ever; and the bread that I will give, is my flesh, for the life of the world." (Jn 6:51-52)

As food for the soul, Holy Communion enhances the supernatural life of the soul and protects the it from evil. It helps to combat our evil inclinations and strengthens us against sin. It enkindles our charity and inspires us with contrition for our sins. It also erases the effects of the venial sins that we have confessed, and preserves us from mortal sin. In addition, we have in the Holy Eucharist this pledge of Jesus Christ that we will have eternal life: "He that eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, hath everlasting life: and I will raise him up in the last day." (Jn 6:55) In an ancient antiphon used in Eucharistic devotion, we pray, "O Sacred Banquet, in which Christ is received... the soul is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory to us is given."

The image of the banquet or marriage feast is used in Sacred Scripture to describe the great joy and happiness for the union of the soul with God. Jesus Himself announces that He will no longer drink of the fruit of the vine: "And I say to you, I will not drink from henceforth of this fruit of the vine, until that day when I shall drink it with you new in the kingdom of my Father." (Mt 26:29) This is the new wine to which the prophet Isaiah alludes: "And the Lord of hosts shall make unto all people in this mountain, a feast of fat things, a feast of wine, of fat things full of marrow, of wine purified from the lees." (Is 25:6) We have a foretaste of this new wine in Holy Communion, when we have the happiness of being able to be with Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament and enter in some way into heaven while still on earth. "Build up a faith in the Holy Eucharist," says St Josemaria Escriva. "Be filled with wonder before the ineffable reality. We have God with us; we can receive Him every day and, if we want we can speak intimately with Him, just as we talk with a friend, as we talk with a brother, as we talk with a father, as we talk with love itself."

St Paul warns us in today's Second Reading to combat evil by being filled with the Holy Spirit: "But as wise: redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Wherefore become not unwise, but understanding what is the will of God. And be not drunk with wine, wherein is luxury; but be ye filled with the holy Spirit." (Eph 5:16-18) It is so easy to be caught up in the wickedness of the world; this is why St Paul enjoins us to be "filled with the holy Spirit, speaking to yourselves in psalms, and hymns, and spiritual canticles, singing and making melody in your hearts to the Lord; giving thanks always for all things, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to God and the Father." (Eph 5:18-20) We need to use time well; St Augustine would have us "purchase eternity with the coin of time." The Holy Eucharist is a foretaste of our eternal glory. The more we partake of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ in the Holy Eucharist, the more we will grow in grace and achieve heavenly glory. St John Marie Vianney, the Cure of Ars, speaks of the Holy Eucharist as "an eternal pledge to us. It assures us of heaven. This is the dowry sent to us by heaven as a promise that one day it will be our resting place. What is more, Jesus Christ will cause our bodies to rise again with greater glory, insofar as we have frequently and everlastingly received Him in Holy Communion."
