

ST MARY'S RENOVATIONS:

PARISH WALKING PILGRIMAGE:

Over the weekend of 18th/19th August, Father Pio will be leading a pilgrimage along the Way of Saint Augustine (Canterbury Cathedral to the Shrine of St Augustine in Ramsgate), to commemorate the 6th Century journey undertaken by St Augustine, who was sent by Pope Gregory the Great to bring the Faith to the English. The walk is around 19 miles long. Upon arriving at the Shrine of St Augustine, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass will be offered. This pilgrimage is open to all who are able to maintain a good walking pace over the required distance. SACRED HEART OF JESUS:

The Mystery Of God's Grace In The Soul

Today's readings tell of the growth of plants in nature. Jesus uses nature in parables to make us see the great mysteries that the visible creation can explain to us. St Paul says, "For the invisible things of him, from the creation of the world, are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made; his eternal power also, and divinity." (Rom 1:20) In the First Reading, the Prophet Ezechiel tells us of the magnificence of the great cedars of Lebanon, which God has created for us as an illustration of His mighty power and wisdom: "I myself will take of the marrow of the high cedar, and will set it: I will crop off a tender twig from the top of the branches thereof, and I will plant it on a mountain high and eminent." (Ez 17:22) In the Gospel reading from St Mark, Jesus uses the growth of the seed to illustrate the mystery of the Kingdom of God: "And he said: So is the kingdom of God, as if a man should cast seed into the earth... For the earth of itself bringeth forth fruit, first the blade, then the ear, afterwards the full corn in the ear." (Mk 4:26-28)

Jesus uses the Parable of the Mustard Seed to reveal the mystery of the grace in the soul: "It is as a grain of mustard seed: which when it is sown in the earth, is less than all the seeds that are in the earth: And when it is sown, it growth up, and becometh greater than all herbs..." (Mk 4:31-32) Like the mustard seed, which grows mysteriously into a large plant, the soul grows spiritually with the divine life of God (i.e. sanctifying grace) that comes into the soul at Baptism. The Holy Spirit infuses into every soul in the state of grace the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, the seven infused virtues, the blessings of the Eight Beatitudes, and the twelve fruits of the Holy Spirit. The growth of holiness is due to the Holy Spirit's action with grace and accompanying virtues and blessings in each soul.

The Holy Spirit continues to sanctify every soul every minute of the day. He does this through innumerable inspirations, which are, as St Francis de Sales tells us, "the attractions, motions, rebukes, and interior compunctions, lights and intuitions which God works in us. So He strengthens our heart with His blessings, with His care and fatherly love, so as to arouse us, move us, impel us and draw us to holy virtues, to heavenly love, to good resolution: in short, to all that leads to our eternal life." The Holy Spirit does this by means of many graces in the form of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, which effect the action of grace in soul. These gifts are fear of the Lord, piety, counsel, fortitude, wisdom, knowledge, and understanding.

The gift of fear enlightens us to understand, as Pope St John Paul II says, that "sin is at the root of the moral evils which divide and ravage society." The gift of piety enables us to have the ardent desire to please God in all things, and to devote ourselves wholeheartedly to the service of God. If we wish to respond to the inspirations of the gift of piety, we must make every effort to be kind and gentle, and to form the habit of seeing in everyone a child of God and our brother. The essence of the gift of piety concerns our relationship to God, our Father, as His sons and daughters. In his book In Conversation with God, Fr Francis Fernandez explains the gift of counsel: "The gift of counsel is like a supernatural instinct for knowing which way gives glory to God... The Paraclete inspires us when we choose the means to carry out God's will. He leads us along paths which involve charity, peace, joy, sacrifice, fulfilment of duty, and faithfulness in small things. He marks the path for us at every instant." The theologian and mystic Matthias Scheeben explains the aift of fortitude: "The aift of fortitude assists and quickens the virtues of fortitude and patience, that even in the greatest dangers it may not fail. It animates our courage in order that we may, out of love for God, undertake ever greater and more difficult works and never relax or despair in our high endeavours." By the gift of knowledge, the Holy Spirit helps us to see the nothingness of this world and of creatures: "For what doth it profit a man, if he gain the whole world, and suffer the loss of his own soul?" (Mt 16:26) By the gift of understanding, we come to a deeper knowledge of the mysteries of the Faith. Our faith is limited in understanding the mysteries of God. With the help of the Holy Spirit, we can penetrate God's mysteries with His enlightenment of our minds in a supernatural way. While the gift of understanding enables us to penetrate God's mysteries, the gift of wisdom gives us a delightful knowledge of them, allowing us to taste and savour them. Through this gift, we experience God through love: "O taste, and see that the Lord is sweet." (Ps 33:9)

Like the seed in nature, the growth of sanctifying grace in the soul begins with the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. Thereafter, the soul receives the seven infused virtues (faith, hope, charity, prudence, justice, temperance and fortitude) and the blessings of the Eight Beatitudes: "Blessed are the poor in spirit... Blessed are the meek... Blessed are they that mourn... Blessed are they that hunger and thirst after justice... Blessed are the merciful... Blessed are the clean of heart... Blessed are the peacemakers... Blessed are they that suffer persecution for justice's sake..." (Mt 5:1-10) From these gifts, virtues and blessings, the soul is given the twelve fruits of the Holy Spirit: charity, goodness, peace, joy, kindness, patience, faithfulness, generosity, gentleness, modesty, chastity and continence. The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that these fruits are "the first fruits of eternal glory" even here on earth. How blessed we are to receive sanctifying grace, which is the seed in our soul for eternal life.
