

## PARISH WALKING PILGRIMAGE:

Over the weekend of 18th/19th August, Father Pio will be leading a pilgrimage along the Way of Saint Augustine (Canterbury Cathedral to the Shrine of St Augustine in Ramsgate), to commemorate the 6th Century journey undertaken by St Augustine, who was sent by Pope Gregory the Great to bring the Faith to the English. The walk is around 19 miles long. Upon arriving at the Shrine of St Augustine, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass will be offered. This pilgrimage is open to all who are able to maintain a good walking pace over the required distance. # God's Redemption For Original Sin

In today's First Reading, we read the story of Adam and Eve in paradise. God told them that they could have all the fruits in the Garden of Eden except one: "And he commanded him, saying: Of every tree of paradise thou shalt eat: But of the tree of knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat. For in what day soever thou shalt eat of it, thou shalt die the death." (Gen 2:16-17) God had given them numerous gifts and blessings to enable them to be in union with God and obey Him. In return, He wanted them to show their love for Him by being faithful to His request.

St Francis Fernandez, in his Conversations with God, writes: "God placed man above the rest of creation, 'to have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth.' (Gen 1:26) God therefore endowed man with intelligence and will, so that he might freely give to his Creator a glory far more excellent than that offered to Him by any other creature. Led by His love for man, God ordained furthermore that He would raise man up so that he should have a share in His own divine life and should be able to penetrate in some way His innermost mysteries. This was an endowment far greater than anything that nature could provide. To this end, God freely endowed man with sanctifying grace, and with the supernatural virtues and gifts. He formed him in a state of holiness and justice and gave him the capacity to act supernaturally...

"Moreover, God enriched Adam's nature with other free gifts – of immunity from death, from concupiscence and from ignorance – which are called preternatural gifts. This integrity of human nature in the state of original justice derived from the perfect and free subjection of man's will to his Creator. Strengthened by these gifts, man could not be deceived in the things he knew and he was immune from all error. Man's body enjoyed immortality, not by its own power, but because of a supernatural power imprinted on the soul preserving the body from corruption so long as it was united to God. In Adam, God contemplates the whole of the human race. The gift of original justice and holiness had been given to man, not as to a single person, but as the general principle of the whole of human nature, in such a way that, after him, it would transmitted by means of generation to all future men. We would all have been born in friendship with God and embellished in soul and body with the perfections granted by God. When the moment came, He would have confirmed each one in grace and carried him away from earth without his suffering any pain or having to undergo the moment of death. He would have come in this way to enjoy everlasting happiness in Heaven."

"And Adam said: The woman, whom thou gavest me to be my companion, gave me of the tree, and I did eat. And the Lord God said to the woman: Why hast thou done this? And she answered: The serpent deceived me, and I did eat." (Gen 3:12-13) Because the serpent, Satan, tempted Eve (and through her, Adam) into sin, God would punish Satan by means of a woman; already, at the first moment of sin, God had a plan to redeem man from his sin. He would send His Son, born of a perfect woman, to redeem. This woman, the Blessed Virgin Mary, would, with Her Son, crush the head of the Satan: "I will put enmities between thee and the woman, and thy seed and her seed: she shall crush thy head, and thou shalt lie in wait for her heel." (Gen 3:15) Because She was going to be the Mother of the Redeemer, who would cooperate with Her Son in the great work of redemption, She would be the Co-Redemptrix who would crush the head of Satan. She would never incur original sin, nor any other sin. This privilege was given to Her because of the foreseen merits of Jesus' death on the Cross. In Pope Pius IX's infallible definition of the Immaculate Conception in 1854, he quotes these words of Pope Alexander VII: "Concerning the most Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, ancient indeed is that devotion of the faithful based on the belief that Her soul, in the first instant of its creation and in the first instant of the soul's infusion into the body, was, by a special grace and privilege of God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, Her Son and the Redeemer of the human race, preserved free from all stain of original sin."

The story of creation and redemption should make us all grateful to God for His wonderful promises to man despite Adam and Eve's disobedience. In today's Gospel, we see how Jesus proves that He is God by casting out devils, but He is seen as a devil by the disbelieving Jews: "Amen I say to you, that all sins shall be forgiven unto the sons of men, and the blasphemies wherewith they shall blaspheme: But he that shall blaspheme against the Holy Ghost, shall never have forgiveness, but shall be guilty of an everlasting sin. Because they said: He hath an unclean spirit." (Mk 3:28-30) God will always forgive those who are sorry for their sins, like our first parents, but to those who have no sorrow – who blaspheme the Holy Ghost by denying their guilt – there can be no forgiveness. This was the sin of the scribes who believed that Jesus cast out devils because He Himself was the devil: "And the scribes who were come down from Jerusalem, said: He hath Beelzebub, and by the prince of devils he casteth out devils." (Mk 3:22)
