

# **RED MISSIO BOXES:**



# AN EASTER MESSAGE FROM FATHER SERAFINO:

Dear Parishioners,

In order to wish you a very blessed Easter in this special time of the Liturgical Year, I would like to guide you through a reflection, based on two beautiful liturgical Hymns. One praises the Mystery of the Holy Cross; the other, the Paschal Victim, now risen and glorious. The first is Vexilla Regis ('The Banners of the King', i.e. the Holy Cross) composed by Venantius Fortunatus (530-609) in honour of the relic of the True Cross arriving in France; the second is the Victimae Paschali ('To the Paschal Victim', i.e. Christ Our Lord), the sequence for Easter Sunday, composed later, in the 11th Century in Germany.

Let us see the internal mysterious connection of the two Hymns: the first leads us harmoniously to the second. The start of *Vexilla Regis* points out the mystery of the Cross as the royal throne of the Lord. From the Cross, the Victory of Christ over death already shines forth. God rules over all nations from a Tree! The first three verses read as follows:

ABROAD the regal banners fly, now shines the Cross's mystery: upon it Life did death endure, and yet by death did life procure.

Who, wounded with a direful spear, did purposely to wash us clear from stain of sin, pour out a flood of precious water mixed with blood.

That which the prophet-king of old hath in mysterious verse foretold, is now accomplished, whilst we see God ruling the nations from a Tree.

After having prayed this Hymn during Vespers, from Passion Sunday to Maundy Thursday, the Liturgy lets us sing, on Easter Sunday and throughout the Octave, the praise to the Paschal Lamb, our Victorious Sacrifice. Its first three verses prominently show us the intersection of death and life, Cross and Love. They read:

CHRISTIANS, to the Paschal Victim offer sacrifice and praise.

The sheep are ransomed by the Lamb; and Christ, the undefiled, hath sinners to his Father reconciled

> Death with life contended: combat strangely ended! Life's own Champion, slain, yet lives to reign.

What can we learn from this? Easter is a time of joyful praise to God for the Resurrection of Jesus, the sacrificed Lamb of God, who ransomed us from eternal punishment. Resurrection does not only follow the Cross, but it can never happen without the Cross. In fact, it is this Royal Banner that conquers sin and death. It is on the Cross indeed that the battle between the devil and Christ is fought and won. The Risen Lord holds forever in his luminous Body the wounds of his love for us. What a price to pay to bring us back to life! Let us rejoice in the Lord, but let joy never distract us from considering how we were saved. Only faith, hope and love are an adequate response. Happy Easter to you all, on behalf of all my confreres too!
